Note: Neither the Tournament Committee nor NSWGFA, nor any sponsor will be liable for any loss or damage to any person, property, personal injury, or death howsoever occasioned at any time during the 2023 NSWGFA All Ports Tournament. All anglers participate entirely at their own risk.

“A” ENTRIES

1. **NSWGFA CLUBS** are invited to nominate **boats**, each of which **MUST** be registered and compliant with all NSW Roads and Maritime Services (NSWRMS) safety equipment requirements with that Member Club.
2. **NSWGFA** reserves the right to refuse entry to the Tournament.
3. **BOATS** entering the 2023 NSWGFA All Ports Tournament **MUST** be registered vessels on the club's vessel list which must be of a Club affiliated with NSWGFA. **The Boat Captain and all crew involved in the capture or the tag and release (anglers, boat skippers, wire/trace man, gaffer or tagger) of a fish must be financial club members.**
4. **ENTRY FEES** There is an entry fee of **\$175.00** (incl. GST) boats under 8 metres and **\$250.00** boats over 8 metres. **Completed entry forms together with proof of insurance as stated in Rule “A” 6 and fees MUST be forwarded to your CLUB SECRETARY by 12th February 2023.** Incomplete entry forms will be rejected, **full boat list and entry forms must be received by 20th February 2023 from your club secretary, strictly no entries will be accepted after this date.**
5. **LATE FEE – No late fee as we will not accept entries after 20th February 2023.**
6. **INSURANCE** – each vessel is to have their own Third-Party Liability Insurance and Boat Owner **MUST** provide details of insurance covering third party property liability and third-party personal liability insurance on the *Boat Safety Rescue form*.
7. **REFUND – Tournament entry fee will be refunded, only in the event a Gail warning is issued in your elected area for both days and you do not wish to change port.**

“B” TOURNAMENT RULES

1. **THE TOURNAMENT COMMITTEE** to conduct the competition shall comprise of the NSWGFA Executive.
2. **MISCONDUCT** – the Tournament Committee may on its own initiative investigate and act upon any incident of misconduct by any person on a boat, be he/she registered for the tournament or not occurring during the tournament. The Committee may impose penalties of loss of points, disqualification of fish, angler, boat or team and refusal of entry to any future NSWGFA Interclub Tournaments. All competitors are reminded that as members of a Club they are regarded as representatives of that Club, as such, any unbecoming behaviour reflects adversely on that Club and indeed on all Game Fishers, hence, **the Tournament Committee reserves the right to take any action it deems necessary in these circumstances.** It is an expectation that all participants will conduct themselves in a responsible and courteous manner to Tournament Officials and other Competitors always throughout the Tournament. Penalties for misconduct may include disqualification from the Tournament.
3. **PROTESTS – any protest** relative to a capture or tag & release must be submitted in writing by the Boat Captain to the Tournament Secretary. **Protests MUST be lodged no later than 9.00 pm on the day of the incident concerned. Note: the tournament committee has the right to act on any breach of any tournament rule whether a protest is lodged.**
4. **REQUEST FOR RECONSIDERATION** of a penalty imposed by the Tournament Committee must be submitted in writing by the Boat Captain to the Tournament Secretary no later than 8.00 pm on the day following the incident concerned.
5. **ALL 2023 NSWGFA ALL PORTS TOURNAMENT DECISIONS AND RULINGS ARE FINAL AND BINDING ON ALL ENTRANTS.**
6. **AN ONLINE BRIEFING will be held on Thursday 2nd March 2023 at 7.00 pm. It is compulsory to register and verify the entry form as being correct.**
7. **NO REPLACEMENT OF BOATS AND COMPETITORS** will be allowed after **28th February 2023.** Anglers may not affect a capture or tag & release on any other vessel than the vessel he/she is registered on.

Captured fish, tag & release card, the angler, all equipment used in the capture or tag must be presented to the weigh station on the vessel on which the capture or tag & release was effected and may not be transferred to another vessel however in the case of an emergency the Tournament Committee may at their discretion allow the transfer of an angler/fish and equipment used to affect the capture or tag.

8. **SEAWORTHINESS OF BOATS** All boats must comply with NSW RMS regulations for safety equipment and the safety standards of the vessel's home Club. A "Boat Safety Rescue form" is included as part of the entry form and must be completed and signed by the Boat Skipper. All boats must carry a **406 MHz EPIRB** and have two working marine radios fitted one of which must be **VHF** frequency
9. **BOAT NUMBERS** will be issued via email for the purpose of identifying your vessel during scheds.
10. **STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS** – all boats must comply with NSW RMS regulations for safety equipment and the safety **standards of the vessel's home club**. All competitors are reminded of the requirement for a NSW DPI licence and bag limits when fishing.
11. **FISHING DAYS & TIMES**
Saturday 4th & Sunday 5th March 2023. On **Saturday 4th March** fishing will commence at 7.30am and finish 5.30pm.
On **Sunday 5th March** starting time will be at 7.30 am and finish 5.30pm, all captures, and tags must be received by 8.30pm on Sunday 5th March. Boats must log on to the radio operator from port they leave from with number on board. **Boats must nominate the port and boundaries they are fishing from on the entry form.**
12. **LEAVING AND ENTERING THE PORT** – Boats must Fish under their own club's rules when returning and leaving from port
13. **BAD WEATHER** – to avoid taking unnecessary risks in the event of bad weather the Tournament Committee will decide whether the day will be a competition day or not. Boats should establish early morning contact from 7.00am with Game Fish Base. In the event of bad weather developing after the start of fishing then the NSWGFA President and the All ports Tournament Committee will confer and decide whether the competition will be called off for the remainder of the day. All fish caught prior to this time will be eligible for the competition. Note: A declaration of a Gale Warning by the appropriate government weather authority requires the cancellation of the tournament. In the event of a declaration whilst vessels are at sea, such vessels are required to cease fishing immediately and return to port. Cancellation will only apply until the Gale Warning is lifted, boats fishing out of a port where a Gale warning is issued may elect to leave to an alternate port (**Approval is required from your zone chairperson**) The Tournament Committee accepts no responsibility for decisions made by individuals whether to put to sea or not, having regard to the Committee's decision on the Tournament for the day. The ultimate decision on return to harbour remains with the competitors. It is requested that all boats display the appropriate capture and/or tag & release flags on return to port. Capture flags should be displayed on the port outrigger (when available) and tag & release flags on the starboard rigger with the species flag followed by the tag flags.
14. **AWARDS** – The 2023 NSWGFA All Ports Tournament Trophies and Awards are listed in schedule attached on page 7, and suitable mementos will be distributed at the NSWGFA All Ports presentation - **date and venue TBC.**

"C" FISHING RULES

The 2023 NSWGFA All Ports Tournament will be fished under the "Fishing Rules and Tackle Regulations" of the GFAA and NSWGFA as are in effect at the time. Note: The Tag & Release rules also are published by NSWGFA and will apply, in addition NSWGFA point scores, fishing rules and minimum weights will apply.

- (a) **LINE CLASSES** – which will be recognised, are 4kg (no sharks), 6kg, 8kg, 10kg, 15kg, 24kg, 37kg and 60kg.
- (b) **CAPTURE** - **Adult Angler MINIMUM WEIGHT TO QUALIFY**
- (c) **MARLIN** must weigh a minimum of 70kg on line class to 10kg and a minimum of 90kg on 15kg line class and over. Black, Blue & Striped Marlin
- (d) **YELLOWFIN TUNA & SOUTHERN BLUEFIN TUNA** – 15kg on line classes up to and including 15kg line, equal to line class for over 15kg line and for Junior Anglers equal to line class in all cases.
- (e) **SHARKS** must weigh a minimum of 70kg on line class to 10kg and a minimum of 90kg on 15kg line class to 37kg and 130kg on 60kg line class. No points shall be awarded for shark captures on 4kg line class. Whaler, Smooth Hammerhead ONLY, Mako (all), Porbeagle, Thresher (all).

Tiger Sharks. New Min. Weights - Effective 1st September 2022

Line Classes 6 – 10kg min. 120kg

Line Classes 15 – 24kg min. 200kg

Line Classes 37 – 60kg min. 250kg

Blue Sharks. New Min. Weights - Effective 1st September 2022

Line Classes 6 – 10kg min. 100kg

Line Classes 15 – 24kg min. 125kg

Line Classes 37 – 60kg min. 150kg

- (f) **OTHER GAME FISH** must weigh at least equal to the breaking strain of the line class used. Sailfish, Shortbill Spearfish, Broadbill, Bigeye Tuna, Bluefin Tuna, Dogtooth Tuna, Longtail Tuna, Albacore, Wahoo, Spanish Mackerel, Yellowtail Kingfish, Cobia, Barracuda and Mahi Mahi** Junior Angler personal points only – Striped Tuna & Kawa Kawa. Striped Tuna Catch & Release Only Same Points Apply
- (g) **SHARKS – No Sharks** will be weighed with restrictive device on jaws. Sewing up of shark jaws will automatically disqualify a capture. No shark will be weighed with a choker in place
- (h) **MARLIN** – The use of identifiable Marlin carcasses is prohibited for use as tethered burley. Burley secured under floats is prohibited.

Junior and Small Fry Angler Minimum Weights

- (a) **CAPTURE - MINIMUM WEIGHT TO QUALIFY**
- (b) **MARLIN** must weigh a minimum of 60kg on line class to 10kg and a minimum of 80kg on 15kg line class and over. Black, Blue & Striped Marlin
- (c) **YELLOWFIN TUNA & SOUTHERN BLUEFIN TUNA** – Equal to line class in all cases
- (d) **SHARKS** must weigh a minimum of 60kg on line class to 10kg and a minimum of 80kg on 15kg line class to 37kg and 120kg on 60kg line class. No points shall be awarded for shark captures on 4kg line class Smooth Hammerhead ONLY, Blue, Mako (all), Porbeagle, Thresher (all), Tiger, Whaler (All) (excluding oceanic White tip)
- (e) **OTHER GAME FISH** must weigh at least equal to the breaking strain of the line class used. Sailfish, Shortbill Spearfish, Broadbill, Bigeye Tuna, Bluefin Tuna, Dogtooth Tuna, Longtail Tuna, Albacore, Wahoo, Spanish Mackerel, Yellowtail Kingfish, Cobia, Barracuda and Mahi Mahi ** Junior Angler personal points only – Striped Tuna & Kawa Kawa. – **Measure & Release Only Same Points Apply**
- (f) **SHARKS– No Sharks** will be weighed with restrictive device on jaws. Sewing up of shark jaws will automatically disqualify a capture. No shark will be weighed with a choker in place.
- (g) **MARLIN** – The use of identifiable Marlin carcasses is prohibited for use as tethered burley. Burley secured under floats is prohibited.

THE METHOD OF RELEASING TAGGED FISH -The hook is to be removed or the leader cut as close as possible to the fish. A fish is considered tagged and released when tag is secured to the fish and the fish is released back into the water alive.

(a) **POINTS** will be awarded as per NSWGFA Tag & Release point score.

(b) **CIRCLE HOOKS ONLY** are permitted to be used for live baiting and trolling natural baits (whether live, dead, mutilated or dissected). Except in the case of targeting Narrow Barred Mackerel (*Scomberomorus Commerson*) NB: no points to be scored for any species caught while using live baits and/or trolling natural baits with "J" hooks.



CIRCLE HOOK DEFINITION: CIRCLE HOOK A hook with its point turned 90 degrees or less back towards the shank of the hook.

- (c) **BILLFISH TAG** – all billfish must be tagged with the billfish tag; this is the only tag that will be recognised for billfish in this tournament. The billfish tag is for billfish only point score i.e. no other species.
 - (d) **ELIGIBLE SPECIES** – as per tag & release point score table – Available on the NSWGFA Website. **Blue, Smooth Hammerhead ONLY, Mako (all), Porbeagle, Thresher (all), Tiger, Great White, Whaler (excluding oceanic White tip)**
 - (e) **LINE CLASS** - must be provided on tag & release forms and cards. If no line class is provided it will be deemed to have been caught on 60kg tackle.
 - (f) **TIME** - Failure to record time of release on the tag card will result in the time being recorded as at the end of the days fishing or after the last fish for the day has been tagged, whichever is the latter.
- 3. "D" OPERATIONS**
- (a) **COMMUNICATIONS** – radio schedules will be conducted as per the NSWGFA adopted "Guidelines for Radio Schedules" as are in affect at the time. Each zone will operate their own sched, depending on the port you fish from will determine the skeds you will be using. **Radio Schedules will be conducted every TWO hours**
 - (b) **Northern Zone Schedules (Port Stephens) Channel 80 first sched 8.10 then every 2 hours last sched 5.40pm**
 - (c) **Northern Zone Schedules (Port Macquarie) VHF80 first sched 8.10 then every 2 hours last sched 5.40pm**
 - (d) **Northern Zone Schedules (Coffs Harbour) TBD first sched 8.10 then every 2 hours last sched 5.40pm**
 - (e) **Central zone Schedules VHF 82 & VHF 22 first sched 8.10 then every 2 hours last sched 5.40pm**
 - (f) **Southern Zone TBD first sched 8.10 then every 2 hours last sched 5.40pm**
 - (g) Competitors are requested to advise "Radio Base" of the number of persons on board when they sign on by answering the first schedule. Boats will be called in numerical order, regardless of type of radio they have, and the Base will acknowledge each reply by repeating the report. Boats are to report on each schedule as follows: (i) Boat Number; (ii) Boat Name; (iii) Position (using grid map references); (iv) whether Trolling, Drifting or Anchored; (v) **Accurate Fishing Report** using the "000" system, i.e., Strikes, Hook-ups, Captures. If possible, boats are to give Species for Strikes and Hook-ups which are not landed. All boats are to report on every schedule. In the interests of safety, communication on each schedule is compulsory. **Failure to answer two (2) consecutive radio schedules will incur a penalty.** In the event of a boat suffering radio failure then they must contact another competing boat and have them advise Game Fish Base of the problem at the next schedule and immediately return to port. Boats must maintain RADIO SILENCE for 10 minutes before FINISH FISHING TIME to allow for reports of late hook-ups. On the 5.40pm schedule, boats are requested to advise Base of total tag and release or captures for the day. All boats are to sign off with "Game Fish Base" when they enter port at the end of the days fishing. If unable to make radio contact, then they must report to the weigh station (**Port they are fishing out of**) before proceeding to their moorings/trailer. **Failure to report on return to port will invoke a penalty.** All boats are requested to avoid chatter on tournament frequencies. If competitors wish to talk to each other, please use another frequency and leave the tournament frequencies clear for safety and/or tournament business only. **Inappropriate radio use is not only an offence under the Communications Act but will incur a penalty.**
 - (h) **WEIGHSTATION CONTROL AND PROCEDURES – Club Rules apply where fish are processed. Tackle to be checked in.**
 - (i) **CAPTURE and TAG & RELEASE DOCUMENTATION** – all captures and tag & release presented to the weigh station MUST be accompanied by correctly completed documentation. As per standard NSWGFA capture books, signed by authorised weigh master nominated prior to the event. **Clubs must send copies of tag cards & capture certificates to your Zone Chairperson by 9pm Monday 6th March 2023.**
 - (j) **IDENTIFICATION OF SPECIES** – in the event of any dispute regarding species of fish the decision of the Tournament Committee shall be final.
 - (ii) **SCIENTISTS** – It has been the practice of the Association to invite Research Scientists to the weigh station to gather measurements, weights and samples from fish weighed in. Anglers are requested to co-operate with these people and no other scientists.

- (iii) **FISH – STANDARD CLUB PORT RULES WILL APPLY.** Fish may not be left at the weigh station, but must be taken by boat disposed of in an appropriate manner if the boat is incapable of disposing of the fish safely you must inform a tournament official to organise an alternative) **Failure to comply with this rule and the direction given will disqualify the capture.**
- **NSWGFA** will notify the clubs that have boats fishing from their ports and it will be those clubs that will be responsible to have their weigh stations available to weigh fish, receive tag cards and capture certificates and check tackle.

Competitors must not clean or fillet fish or remove shark jaws near the weigh station, beaches, marinas, or places frequented by the public. Fish carcasses must not be hung off boat's moorings, or marinas. If required, traces to be removed at the weigh station by or at the direction of a Tournament Committee member. Shark jaws to be removed on board boats only. Small boats to utilise larger boats if necessary. All boats must empty burley pots before entering the port. **Penalties will be imposed for any breach of these rules. In the event of any shark or marlin given away for eating, only the fillets may be given, and the remaining carcass is the responsibility of the skipper and crew.**

- (k) **SALE OF FISH** – Competitors are reminded that it is illegal for recreational or un-licensed anglers to sell their catches. The following rule has been adopted by the Association: "That any fish weighed for NSWGFA Trophies shall not be sold or bartered. Such fish shall be ineligible for any trophies or awards of the Association". **Anyone found to have sold their catch will be disqualified from the tournament. BAG LIMITS – All anglers must abide by** the current NSW Government laws on bag limits.
- (l) **MEDIA** – only media representatives accredited by the NSWGFA and officially identifiable will be allowed access to the weigh stations. The NSWGFA logo, NSWGFA (name) or Official Tournament Name cannot be used in any media publication (including internet websites) without the express permission of the NSWGFA. **Any breach of this rule can invoke a penalty.**

4. "E" PENALTIES

Note: Penalties WILL APPLY to BOTH Capture and Tag & Release Points

- (a) **MISCONDUCT** – Penalties at the discretion of the Tournament Committee –
- (b) **FAILURE TO SIGN OFF ON RETURN TO PORT** – loss of 10,000 capture & 10,000 tag & release points.
- (c) **BREACH OF NO WASH RULE** – loss of 2,000 capture & 2,000 tag & release points – (If applicable in Port you are fishing from)
- (d) **FAILURE TO ANSWER TWO (2) CONSECUTIVE RADIO SCHEDULES & INAPPROPRIATE RADIO USAGE** – loss of 10,000 capture & 10,000 tag & release points.
- (e) **FISH DISPOSAL** – Failure to comply with this rule and the direction given will disqualify the fish.
- (f) **DISCHARGE OF WASTE OR RUBBISH** – Non-compliance with current NSW RMS regulations will attract a loss of 2,000 capture and 2,000 tag & release points.
- (g) **SALE OF FISH** – disqualification from tournament.
- (h) **BREACH OF MEDIA RULE** – Penalties at the discretion of the Tournament Committee – see G Operations

Notwithstanding the above penalties, the Tournament Committee reserves the right in any circumstance to Disqualify any capture, angler or boat for disregarding any 2023 NSWGFA All Ports Tournament Rule or Instruction
