



NEW SOUTH WALES GAME FISHING ASSOCIATION TOURNAMENT RULES FOR SANCTIONING

THIS IS A GUIDE ONLY – THERE MAY BE ADDITIONAL AMENDMENTS REQUIRED BEFORE TOURNAMENT IS FORMALLY SANCTIONED.

The Executive of the Association must be consulted by Member Clubs wishing to conduct "Open" or Invitation" Tournaments to gain approval for such tournaments. **Please Note a minimum of 14 days initial processing time of application. Application process can take up to 1 month to complete so please make sure to have your tournament sanctioning application within a minimum of 3 month prior to the commencement of your tournament.**

EXAMPLE: If your tournament is on the 10th May, the application needs to be in the hands of the NSWGFA Secretary no later than 10th February.

- A Sanctioning Application fee of **\$220 Inc. GST** will be charged for every Tournament Sanctioning Application.
- The Executive shall also have the power to insist that any such tournaments hosted by Member Clubs be conducted in such fashion as is befitting the ethics of Gamefishing, and for the maximum enjoyment of all participants.
- The application for such tournaments **MUST** be in the hands of the NSWGFA Secretary **a minimum of three (3) months prior to the tournament date. Any application that is received less than 3 months will be charged a late administration fee of \$250.00 +GST.**
- Such applications shall include the proposed dates, angling rules, regulations, and details of trophy categories that will be awarded.
- All sanctioned game fishing tournaments and point score competitions held from NSWGFA waters must be fished/conducted under the GFAA and NSWGFA rules as are in effect at the time.
- A Junior Angler is an angler who is under the age of 16 years. A Junior Angler becomes a Senior Angler on his/her 16th birthday. A Club **CANNOT** rule that a Junior Angler can enter a tournament as a Senior Angler and be bound by the Senior Rules – A Junior Angler is a Junior regardless of what entry fee is paid and **MUST** be allowed to fish by any applicable Junior rule e.g., Minimum Weights – Yellowfin Tuna & Southern Bluefin Tuna.
- A Small Fry Angler (if there is a category for S/Fry) is an angler who is under the age of 11 years. A Small Fry Angler becomes a Junior Angler on his/her 11th birthday. A Club **CANNOT** rule that a Small Fry Angler can enter a tournament as a Junior (if there is a category for S/Fry) or Senior Angler and be bound (in the case of Senior) by Senior Rules - A small fry angler (if there is a category for S/Fry) is a Small Fry Angler regardless of what entry fee is paid and **MUST** be allowed to fish by any applicable Small Fry rule e.g. Minimum weights - Yellowfin & Southern Bluefin Tuna.
- If there are two divisions i.e., Junior & Small Fry – Junior Angler must be 11years to under 16 years, Small Fry Angler must be under 11 years.
- All sanctioned tournaments shall have two (2) separate categories when allocating points i.e. capture and tag & release, such categories are mandatory and non-combinable for trophies/competitions.

- NSWGFA Minimum Weights & Pointscore will apply as are in effect at the time. Note: A Club may, with the approval of the Association given, at the time of sanctioning, specify a higher minimum weight for Marlin, Shark or a Tuna to qualify for a trophy for the Heaviest Marlin, Shark or Tuna ONLY, provided that the weight specified is reasonable and obtainable in the circumstances. Clubs are to provide with application three (3) years of capture statistics that show that the minimum weight that is being applied for is achievable for that species.
- Clubs may choose for tournament purposes: line class, fish species for capture and tag & release from the NSWGFA designated line classes and fish species category list.
- Tournament Radio Schedules are to be conducted in accordance with “NSWGFA Guidelines for Radio Skeds for Tournaments” as are in effect at the time as the minimum radio procedure to be followed – this must be stated in tournament rules.
- Clubs will be notified if there are any amendments required to tournament rules.
- Amended tournament rules and signed declaration stating that the Club agrees to abide by the conditions as set down by NSWGFA with respect to the tournament are to be forwarded to NSWGFA. The “Official Sanction Emblem” will then be forwarded to the Club which; must be shown on the front of the official entry form.
- Clubs can advertise the tournament prior to sanction but **MUST NOT** include in this advertising a sanctioned emblem.
- Clubs **CANNOT** send out the official entry form to other Clubs or Skippers until after the tournament has been officially sanctioned and the appropriate emblem has been received.
- Once a tournament has been sanctioned, rules and trophy category list cannot be altered without permission from the NSWGFA Executive. If permission to alter the rules or trophy list is given, then all participating anglers must be notified either by mail or at the tournament briefing.
- A complete list of tournament trophies and prizes **MUST BE** advised in writing to competitors prior to the start of the tournament– these trophies cannot be changed however additional trophies or prizes can be added after the tournament commences.
- All trophies/prizes being offered in the tournament must be considered “winnable”.
- A copy of the entry form as forwarded to other Clubs and Boat Skippers is to be forwarded to NSWGFA, this entry form must include the sanctioned tournament rules.

An Invitation is extended to anglers who are financial members/life members of a Club affiliated with New South Wales Game Fishing Association (NSWGFA) or with a State Association, which is affiliated with the Game Fishing Association of Australia (GFAA) (or a bona-fide international member of the International Game fishing Association (IGFA))

TOURNAMENT RULES

1. TOURNAMENT COMMITTEE

The Tournament Committee shall consist of (the Club's Committee), (Names of Tournament Committee if not Club Committee), the Tournament Coordinator is (Name & Contact number during tournament).

2. ENTRIES

Boat Skippers must read all tournament rules and forward completed entry forms and fees to (the Club) by (date). The cost of entry is (Cost) Adult Angler, (Cost) Junior Angler (J) – 11 years to under 16 years at commencement of briefing and Small Fry (SF) – under 11 years at commencement of briefing, (Club Name) reserves the right to refuse entry to the Tournament.
(List whether the entry form includes Presentation Dinner or any other function for registered anglers).

3. LATE ENTRIES

Late entries will be accepted (up until commencement of briefing or date and whether there is a late fee associated).

4. TEAMS

(All boats or define what length) shall consist of a minimum of (No of anglers) with a maximum limit to the number of anglers as per NSW Maritime Vessel Capacity.

5. REPLACEMENT OF BOATS AND COMPETITORS

No replacement of boats and competitors will be allowed after the commencement of the tournament. Anglers may not effect a capture or tag & release on any other vessel than the vessel he/she is registered on. Captured fish, tag & release card, the angler, all equipment used in the capture or tag must be presented to the weigh station on the vessel on which the capture or tag & release was effected and may not be transferred to another vessel however in the case of an emergency situation the Tournament Committee may at their discretion allow the transfer of an angler/fish and equipment used to effect capture or tag.

6. SEAWORTHINESS OF BOATS

All boats must comply with NSW Waterways regulations for safety equipment and the safety standards of the vessel's home Club. A "Boat Safety Rescue form" is included as part of the entry form and must be completed and signed by the Boat Skipper. All boats must carry a **406Mhz EPIRB** and have two working marine radios fitted one of which must be **VHF** frequency.

7. INSURANCE

It is mandatory for all boats to carry Third Party Property Damage and Third-Party Personal Injury Insurance to be a minimum of (\$5,000,000) and a copy of policy details MUST be supplied with boat entry form before entry can be accepted.

8. STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS

All anglers must carry Saltwater Fishing Licences (if applicable). Bag limit and size restrictions must also be adhered to. All competitors are reminded that it is an offence to tie any vessel to objects such as wave riders, FADs or fish trap buoys.

9. FISHING DAYS & TIMES

(List all fishing days & times e.g:
Saturday 16th & Sunday 17th July

Saturday 16th July 7.00 am to 4.00 pm

Note: Any fish hooked and reported to (Tournament Base) prior to finish of fishing may be played out and if caught will be eligible for the tournament.

Sunday 17th July 7.00 am to 3.00 pm

Note: any fish hooked and reported to (Tournament Base) prior to finish of fishing may be played out and if caught will be eligible for the tournament provided the angler, fish and/or tag (and full equipment) is presented to the weigh station by (5.00pm).

10. FISHING AREA

The fishing area for the tournament is (list fishing area if applicable)

11. BAD WEATHER

To avoid taking unnecessary risks in the event of bad weather the Tournament Committee will decide whether the day will be a competition day or not. Boats should establish early morning contact with Game Fish Base or members of the Tournament Committee at the weigh station. In the event of bad weather developing after the start of fishing then the Tournament Committee will confer and decide whether or not the tournament will be called off for the remainder of the day. All fish caught prior to this time will be eligible for the competition.

Cancellation will only apply until Gale Warning is lifted.

Note: A declaration of a Gale Warning by the appropriate government weather authority require the cancellation of the tournament. In the event of a declaration whilst vessels are at sea, such vessels are required to cease fishing immediately and return to port.

The Tournament Committee accepts no responsibility for decisions made by individuals whether to put to seas or not, having regard to the Committee's decision on the Tournament for the day. The ultimate decision on return to harbour remains with the competitors.

12. LEAVING PORT

Boats must leave (host port) on each tournament day
OR

Boats may fish from their home port on (E.g. Saturday 16th July) but CANNOT commence burleying, trolling or fishing before the (Tournament Base) announces the official start of fishing at (7.00 am).

(If a boat is not at that time within the prescribed fishing area on all fishing days, it cannot commence fishing until such time that it is within the tournament fishing boundary.)

13. RETURN TO PORT

Boats must return to (host port) on each tournament day
OR

On (Saturday 16th July), ALL boats must return to (host port). On (Sunday 17th July) boats may elect to return directly to their home port after fishing, but must still affect a sign-off with (Tournament Base). Failure to report on your return will invoke a penalty of (list penalty). Note: All captures, and tag & release cards must be logged at the tournament weigh station.

14. WEIGHSTATION PROCEDURE

Once boats enter the vicinity of the weigh station, they are under the control of the Tournament Official at the weigh station and MUST obey all instructions issued by the Official. Before coming alongside the weigh station, boats must have completed and have ready for presentation all (equipment used to effect the capture & tag and release and) applicable paperwork. Weigh station will open at (4.00 pm) on each fishing day.

(Note: Clubs cannot do random tackle inspections, either all tackle is to be inspected or none)

15. RADIO COMMUNICATIONS

- Radio Schedules will be conducted in accordance with the NSWGFA "Guidelines for Radio Schedules for Tournaments" as are in effect at the time of the tournament.
- (Tournament Base) will call each boat in numerical order on (radio frequencies).
- The radio schedule times will be (list scheduled times).
- Boats must keep the airway clear (10 minutes) prior to the end of fishing so late hook-ups may be recorded by the base on each fishing day.
- The number of people onboard is to be advised during the first scheduled time for the day.
- Boats are to report on each scheduled time as follows:
 - (1) Boat Number
 - (2) Boat Name
 - (3) ACCURATE Fishing Report – using the "000" system, i.e. Strikes – Hook-ups – Captures/Tags and specify Species – Line Class – Angler and accurate approximation of weight of fish (using weight/length graph if available).
 - (4) Position – using (host Club) grid chart reference and whether boat is currently trolling, drifting etc.

Please Note:

- If any vessel is unable to fish on any competition day, it is a requirement that (Tournament Base) be notified, either by radio or by telephone before the 2nd scheduled time starts as a priority.
- Should any vessel suffer total radio failure, the Boat Skipper must attempt to notify another vessel of the problem and have them notify (Tournament Base), they must then immediately return to port. Once in port it is the responsibility of the skipper to sign off with a Tournament Official as listed in Tournament Rule 1.
- If a vessel misses two (2) radio schedules, (Tournament Base) will commence the emergency procedures.
- Captures and Tags not reported on the radio schedule will not be eligible in the tournament point score or trophies.
- All boats are to report on EVERY scheduled time.
- All boats must report to (Tournament Base) on returning to port.
- Radio silence must be observed for (10 mins) prior to the conclusion of fishing to allow for the report of late hook-ups.
- At the final scheduled time for the day each boat is required to confirm their ET back in Port and current grid position.

16. FISH HANDLING

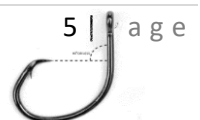
All fish should be removed from the weigh station after weighing. Competitors (and boat crew) must not, without a tournament official's permission, clean or fillet fish or remove shark jaws in the vicinity of the weigh station, not at any time near any beach or harbour foreshore area. Unwanted fish must be taken at least 2nm outside the port and disposed of in an appropriate manner. Note: fish MUST NOT be disposed of in a Marine Park. Failure to comply with this rule will invoke a penalty against the offending boat. In the event of any shark or marlin given away for eating, only the fillets may be given and the remaining carcass is the responsibility of the skipper and crew.

(If a Marine Park is applicable and is situated at the Club's Port then the distance that the fish is taken is to be outside of the Marine Park).

17. FISHING RULES

The tournament will be fished under the "Fishing Rules and Tackle Regulations" of the GFAA and NSWGFA as are in effect at the time. The NSWGFA Tag & Release and Measure & Release rules will apply.

- (1) **LINE CLASSES** – which will be recognised are 4kg (no sharks), 6kg, 8kg, 10kg, 15kg, 24kg, 37kg and 60kg or define the actual line classes that are eligible for this tournament.
- (2) **ELIGIBLE SPECIES** – as per NSWGFA eligible species list OR define the actual species that are eligible for this tournament.



- (3) CIRCLE HOOKS ONLY** are permitted to be used for live baiting and trolling natural baits. (Whether live, dead, mutilated or dissected) Except in the case of targeting Narrow Barred Mackerel (*Scomberomorus Commerson*) NB: no points to be scored for any species caught while using live baits and/or trolling baits with “J” hooks
- (4) THE USE OF IDENTIFIABLE MARLIN** - carcasses is prohibited for use as tethered burley. Burley secured under floats is prohibited.
- (5) MULTIPLE STRIKES** – in the event of a multiple strike on separate lines being fished by a single angler, only the first fish fought will be eligible for point score.
- (6) CAPTURE**
Minimum Weight to qualify (list minimum weights that are applicable to tournament)
- (a) MARLIN** – must weigh a minimum of 70kg on line class to 10kg and a minimum of 90kg on 15kg line class and over. (Black, Blue & Striped Marlin)
- (b) YELLOWFIN TUNA & SOUTHERN BLUEFIN TUNA** – 15kg on line classes up to and including 15kg line, equal to line class for over 15kg line and for Junior Anglers equal to line class in all cases.
- (c) SHARKS** – must weigh a minimum of 70kg on line class to 10kg and a minimum of 90kg on 15kg line class to 37kg and 130kg on 60kg line class. No points shall be awarded for shark captures on 4kg line class. (Hammerhead (), Mako (all), Porbeagle, Thresher (all), Whaler (all). Excluding Tiger Sharks and Blue Sharks
- Tiger Sharks. New Min. Weights - Effective 1st September 2022**
 Line Classes 6 – 10kg min. 120kg
 Line Classes 15 – 24kg min. 200kg
 Line Classes 37 – 60kg min. 250kg
- Blue Sharks. New Min. Weights - Effective 1st September 2022**
 Line Classes 6 – 10kg min. 100kg
 Line Classes 15 – 24kg min. 125kg
 Line Classes 37 – 60kg min. 150kg

Minimum Weights for Junior and Small Fry Anglers

- Yellowfin Tuna: 15kg on line classes up to and including 15kg line, equal to line class for over 15kg line, and for junior anglers equal to the line class in all cases.
 - Southern Bluefin tuna: 15kg on line classes up to and including 15kg line, equal to line class for over 15kg line, and for junior anglers equal to the line class in all cases.
 - Marlin: a minimum of 60kg on line classes to 4kg to 10kg and a minimum of 80kg on 15kg line class and over.
 - Sharks: a minimum of 60kg on line classes 6kg to 10kg, a minimum of 80kg on line classes 15kg to 37kg, and 120kg on 60kg line class.
 - Other Game fish and broadbill: minimum weight to be equal to line class.
- (d) OTHER GAME FISH** must weigh at least equal to the breaking strain of the line class used. (Sailfish, Shortbill Spearfish, Broadbill, Bigeye Tuna, Bluefin Tuna, Dogtooth Tuna, Longtail Tuna, Albacore, Wahoo, Spanish Mackerel, Yellowtail Kingfish, Cobia, Barracuda and Mahi Mahi).

***Junior Angler personal points only – Striped Tuna and Kawa Kawa**

Points – will be calculated as per NSWGFA pointscore factor system. In the event of a tie on any prize category the count back system will be used to determine the winner, i.e. the angler or boat to reach the winning score first will be deemed to be the winner.

(Pointscore system can be printed if you wish to do so)

- (a) SHARKS** – no points shall be awarded for shark captures on 4kg line class
- (b) Maximum points:** all captures on line classes up to and including 10kg shall be maximum of 15,000 plus one point per kilo of fish weight. All captures on line classes 15kg and over shall be maximum 20,000 plus one point per kilo of fish weight.
- (c) *Striped Tuna and *Kawa Kawa** are eligible species for JUNIOR PERSONAL POINT SCORE AND APPLICABLE TROPHIES ONLY.

(7) TAG & RELEASE

- (a) **BILLFISH TAG** – all billfish must be tagged with the billfish tag, this is the only tag that will be recognised for billfish in this tournament. The billfish tag is for billfish only point score i.e., no other species.
- (b) **NSWDPI TAGS** – only NSW DPI tags can be used, no other type tag will be awarded points or trophies.
- (c) **LINE CLASS** – must be provided on tag & release cards. If no line class is provided it will be deemed to have been caught on 60kg tackle.
- (d) **TIME** – Failure to record time of release on the tag card will result in the time being recorded as at the end of the days fishing or after the last fish for the day has been tagged, whichever is the latter.

Points – will be calculated as per NSWGFA point score tag & release line class point score. In the event of a tie on any prize category the count back system will be used to determine the winner, i.e. the angler or boat to reach the winning score first will be deemed to be the winner.

(Points core system can be printed if you wish to do so)

THE METHOD OF RELEASING TAGGED FISH -The hook is to be removed or the leader cut as close as possible to the fish.

Note: A GFAA Measure & Release card is to be used to record Yellowtail Kingfish (under 70cm) release information. The time of release and line class used is to be recorded on the card if no time is listed the fish will be deemed to be released at end of fishing and line class will be deemed to be 60kg.

18. PROTESTS

Any protest must be submitted in writing by the Boat Skipper to the Tournament Committee. Protests must be submitted by (5.30pm) on the fishing day concerned. The decision of the Tournament Committee will be final.

19. MISCONDUCT

The Tournament Committee may on its own initiative investigate and act upon any incident of misconduct by an angler on a boat, be he/she registered for the tournament or not occurring during the tournament. The Committee may impose penalties of loss of points, disqualification of fish, angler, boat or team and refusal of entry to any future (Club) Tournament. All competitors are reminded that as members of a Club they are regarded as representatives of that Club, as such, any unbecoming behaviour reflects adversely on the Club and indeed on all Game Fishers, hence, the Tournament Committee reserves the right to take any action it deems necessary in these circumstances.

20. MEDIA POLICY/Social Media Policy

- Only the Club President can make comment to the media.
- Competitors are NOT to post any inaccurate or inappropriate information/photographs on forum sites.
- Competitors must NOT approach the media or answer any queries from the media. If a Competitor is approached by the media they are to contact Club President with the details who then will carry out the requirements of the NSWGFA Media Policy.
- (The Club logo), (Club name) or (Name of actual tournament) cannot be used in any media publication (including websites, Facebooks ETC) without the express permission of the (Club Name) and then it must be within the guidelines of the NSWGFA Media Policy.
- No Competitor can publish a photograph(s) of any captured fish in any Newspaper, or social media outlet.

OFFICIAL NSWGFA BLOGS, SOCIAL PAGES AND ONLINE FORUMS

- When creating a new website, social networking page or forum for club members, Association Members, tournaments, competitions, or Members generally, care should be taken to ensure the appropriate person has given permission to create the page or forum.

21. SALE OF FISH

Any fish weighed shall not be sold or bartered. Such fish shall be ineligible for any trophies or awards. Anyone found to have sold their catch will be disqualified from the tournament.

22. PENALTIES (example of penalties only)

- Radio Communication – failure to sign off, inappropriate language, failure to answer two (2) consecutive radio scheds – loss of (5,000 capture & T&R points for each breach)
- Excessive boat wash – loss of (2,000 capture & T&R points for each breach)
- Misconduct – penalties at the discretion of the Tournament Committee – see rule (19)
- Sale of Fish – disqualification from tournament – see rule (21)
- Breach of Media Rule – Penalties at the discretion of the Tournament Committee – see rule (20)

25. CONDUCT

It is an expectation that all participants will conduct themselves in a responsible and courteous manner to Tournament Officials and other Competitors at all times throughout the Tournament. Penalties for misconduct may include disqualification from the Tournament.

26. INDEMNITY

(Club Name) accepts no responsibility for the actions by entrants in this Tournament and shall not be held liable for any damage or loss to property or persons during the Tournament. In consideration of accepting this application to participate in the event, all Competitors agree to release or indemnity (Club Name), the Tournament Committee and any or all of their employees, servants, agents and voluntary workers against all claims proceedings or actions for loss or damage to property or person.

27. TROPHY LIST

(List all tournament trophies, ensuring that trophies are clarified if they are Senior or Junior/Small Fry Trophies and Angler or Boat trophies). With prize values.

28. UNDERWRITING PRIZES

We require all information regarding underwriting prize etc including terms and conditions prior to the tournament being assessed.
